



Remembrance Sunday in Warninglid



Following the purchase of a Tommy Memorial by Slaugham Parish Council for each village in the Parish, Jamie and Penny of The Half Moon, said they would be honoured to host the memorial next to the pub. Furthermore they invited the village to join them and watch the Remembrance parade on TV and hold a two minute silence and at the same time offering free coffee and croissants to all. 29 villagers came to pay their respects to the fallen of Warninglid. The fallen included 13 from WWI, 6 from WWII and the 8 alumni of Hollingbury School who gave their lives. There were also civilian casualties. Yogi Turville, a great-nephew of two of the fallen, showed us photos of his great uncles Percy and George. Another photo, of William Langley, the only one that joined the Navy, hangs in the Half Moon. Huge



thanks to Jamie and Penny for hosting this poignant event. Many thanks also go to Carol Pickering, who not only made the poppy wreath for the Warninglid Tommy, but also put together a book of remembrance for the fallen of the whole parish together with the relevant number of crocheted poppies. Such an amazing tribute.

Rosy Brenan Writes about Herman the Marmoset

"The Warninglid Newsletter some time ago, carried an article on Hermann the Marmoset monkey I rescued and had at Colwood House for two years. That was when he went to his new home at the Hopefield Animal Sanctuary, in Brentwood, Essex. Herman was happily integrated with two other marmosets, Oleg who had only one back leg and Jimbo and he should have had at least ten years of happy life before him.

Hopefield has 37 acres, holding 600 animals and has been at its present site for many years but, on the 4th. November some callous neighbours ignored this fact and held a massive firework display! From photos in The Daily Mirror and on social media it looked the same sort of size as the Warninglid Village display, but next to a sanctuary.

Of course there was panic in the Sanctuary. A horse died and Hermann and his friend Oleg (two healthy animals) both died of heart attacks brought on by sheer terror. The staff at Hopefield say they are heartbroken by these senseless deaths and so am I. They have made a complaint to the Local Authority but that will not bring back Hermann.

They are now worried about the third marmoset, Jimbo, who is distraught at the loss of his companions. I thought that anyone who remembers Hermann might like to know about this tragedy.

Note: Since Rosy wrote this, I read with some happiness that two more marmosets, Tia and Diego, have arrived at the sanctuary and there are high hopes that, while they won't replace Herman and Oleg, they will help Jimbo through his grief and become a bonded trio. Volunteer duty officers

We urgently need some help with our organisation. For the benefit of those of you who don't know **Help at Hand** we arrange transport for medical appointments for people here who are not fortunate enough to have their own means of transport.

This is arranged by a panel of duty officers on a rota basis who work for 3 hours a day once or twice a fortnight and receive a handful or less of phone calls from users who then are matched with our panel of drivers and "lifts" booked and recorded.

We currently need, ideally, an additional five people to help. If you are not working and can spare 3 hours (9.00 until Mid Day) once a fortnight we would love to hear from you as we really need more people to keep this valuable organisation afloat.
