Please join us on the 4th August and meet friends and neighbours over coffee. The coffee morning is held in the **Seaforth Hall** the first Friday of every month. Coffee is free but all cash donations, big or small are welcome as it goes to the upkeep of the Seaforth Hall. Thank you to Alan and Tricia Robinson and Mark and Carol Pickering for organising this lovely event each month.

Friday 1st September - Handcross Community Pantry in the Seaforth Hall

The Coffee Morning is also an opportunity to bring along food donations for **Handcross Pantry** which serves those in need in the Parish. This month the Pantry needs the following items: *Rice, Cereals, Long-life milk, tins of fruit, custard, rice pudding, tins of tuna or meat, tea coffee, sugar.*

Please see the attached letter from Barbara Butfoy from the Pantry team & photo from Kristy Adams:

"The Community Pantry has been in operation for 3 1/2 years and was set up in response to a highlighted need to support some families in the parish. We have been blessed by so many donations of food and money on a weekly basis with extra donations at harvest, Christmas and Easter, including collections from local schools and the churches of the parish in addition to regular donors.



We now have collection points in all the villages of the parish in addition to people being able to bring donations on Pantry mornings themselves. The Pantry is held on Saturdays at All Saints Church in Handcross between 10 and 11.30 and we run a café offering free tea/coffee/biscuits and an opportunity to chat.

I was recently asked to think about how much it costs to make up one bag of shopping for a family.... Well that sadly has been an increasing amount over the past few months as prices rise, but I always try and buy additional items we need at low price supermarkets or when they are on offer, to ensure money donated is spent carefully. Each week families receive a basic bag including any fresh bread, fruit and vegetables donated by Tesco. In addition over the course of a month they also receive a £5 meat voucher from Handcross Butchers, as well as tea, coffee, sugar, washing detergent and toiletries. Larger families receive a little extra when we have it. Averaged out per week (including monthly extras and based on prices in late June) the total cost of providing support to a family each week is £20. We are currently supporting 25 families (34 adults and 24 children) so weekly our costs are currently £500!

Over the lifetime of the pantry the total is an amazing £91000 ! It is a testament to each person who has supported us that we have always had enough to give to those most in need in our community and we continue to thank God for blessing our work in His name. It has been lovely to come and meet some of you at the Warninglid monthly coffee morning. We have been so touched by your generosity and willingness to donate each month, as well welcoming us into your community. William's Wood – a little history

Williams's Wood in Warninglid is a small 4 hectare area of semi-natural Ancient Woodland in a wooded area owned by the Woodland Trust and situated in the High Weald AONB. It is half a mile from the village crossroads and the surrounding areas consist of mixed farming and parkland. The land was left to the Woodland Trust in 1993 in the will of Jane Louisa Knapman of Stonewick, now Belle Vue nursing home. The wood was named after her husband William. At that time the voluntary warden for the wood was his daughter Doreen who lived at Stonewick Lodge. The wood was previously part of Har-

vey's Wood. Although small, the site is diverse containing ghyll woodland around two deeply incised streams, which is a typical feature of the High Weald, and with two speciesrich meadows, some tall character trees and a network of paths. The storm of 1987 damaged a lot of the wood and although some was cleared, there are still large rotting trunks about. The Trust has cleared most of the rhododendrons and the meadows have been regularly mowed.

William Knapman's grandson still lives in the village and is an avid woodworker. He is happy to make wood carvings, tables and benches. You can contact him on 07929 000714

WRS News

- **Drain covers**: We have emailed South East Water twice, about the paper-thin man-hole covers on Cuckfield Lane, near the crossroads. One of the covers is so worn it has a large hole in it. We have not had a response although they have been at the site. West Sussex Fire Service came to check it wasn't the Hydrant and then repainted the hydrant adjacent to Rose Cottage.
- **Dog-poo Bins**: We emailed Mid Sussex District Council's Waste, Leisure and Landscaping Division requesting two more dog-poo bins to be installed in the village, on Cuckfield Lane. We have been added to a "Suggested Locations" list for when their next contract is drawn up. At Tuesdays WRS meeting resident Colin Ham suggested they should be put at the entrance to the allotments from The Street and at the driveway entrance to the Rec from Cuckfield Lane.
- Recreation Ground: Further to a Slaugham Parish Council recreation assets meeting, it was
 proposed to put our request for the SPC acquisition of the Rec to full Parish Council meeting on
 31st August. If approved the SPC could approach Mid Sussex District Council. If this went ahead
 it would bring Warninglid in line with Handcross and Pease Pottage recreation grounds and
 pavilions and allotments all of which the parish council manages.
- **PA System**: A portable Yamaha PA system has been purchased (in conjunction with the Seaforth Hall) which can be used indoors or outdoors on the Recreation ground with a wireless microphone. It had a successful debut at the recent quiz night!
- **Coronation Grant/Bench**: The WRS received a £480 Coronation Grant from Mid-Sussex District Council and a Coronation Bench will be purchased for the village in due course.

- **Allotments**: Our request for new post and rail fencing and gates to be installed on the recreation ground side of the allotments was approved by Slaugham Parish Council and quotations are being sought. The work will include clearing overgrown plots and the compost area, which will be turned into another allotment, making 24 in total. There is a waiting list but if you would like an allotment you will get precedence. Call Sally on <u>clerk@slaughampc.co.uk</u>
- **Slaugham Lane:** Residents Clare and John Sergi requested that the footpath be cleared as it is very slippery. It has not been done since the school closed. WRS will email MSDC to request it.
